Introduction

1. At its 60th session, the General Assembly showed the interest to know in detail the extra-budgetary contributions received from member States or private donors. The Secretariat prepared documents to this effect that were submitted to the Governing Council at its 58th session, held in Rome from 16 to 18 April 2007, to the Finance Committee at its 62nd session, held in Rome on 4 October 2007, and to the General Assembly at its 61st session, held in Rome on 29 November 2007, with a view to receiving their opinion.
2. The Governing Council and the Finance Committee shared the interest shown by the General Assembly and agreed that those contributions would have been better appreciated if allocated to the projects and activities of the Institute. This may permit the institutions of UNIDROIT to have a more precise picture of the finances of the Institute.
3. This paper accounts for these contributions as well as the expenditure that were, or will be, funded accordingly in 2010. It is to be noted that other contributions, i.e. direct organization of meetings, payment of travel and accommodation expenses of members of the staff, participation of persons external to the Institute, are not indicated in this paper.

Summary of the extra-budgetary contributions received in 2010 and of their allocation to the projects and activities of the institute.

1. SCHOLARSHIPS PROGRAMME

The Institute received in 2010 contributions from:

- the UK Foundation for International Uniform Law (€ 5,837.71)
- the US Foundation for International Uniform Law (€ 4,500.71)
- the members of the Governing Council (€ 1,860.00)

for the financing of several scholarships, aimed at permitting research periods of approximately two months in the UNIDROIT Library for young lawyers from developing countries or countries in economic transition, in addition to the scholarships funded by the UNIDROIT regular budget (€ 10,000).
