In the lead-up to the World Conference on Cultural Policies in Barcelona (29 September – 1 October 2025), this webinar provides an opportunity to critically consider the public and private international law aspects of multilateral efforts in Asia to address the illicit trade in cultural goods on the 55th anniversary of the adoption of the 1970 UNESCO Convention on the Means of Prohibiting and Preventing the Illicit Import, Export and Transfer of Cultural Property, and the 30th anniversary of the adoption of the 1995 UNIDROIT Convention on Stolen or Illegally Exported Cultural Objects.
