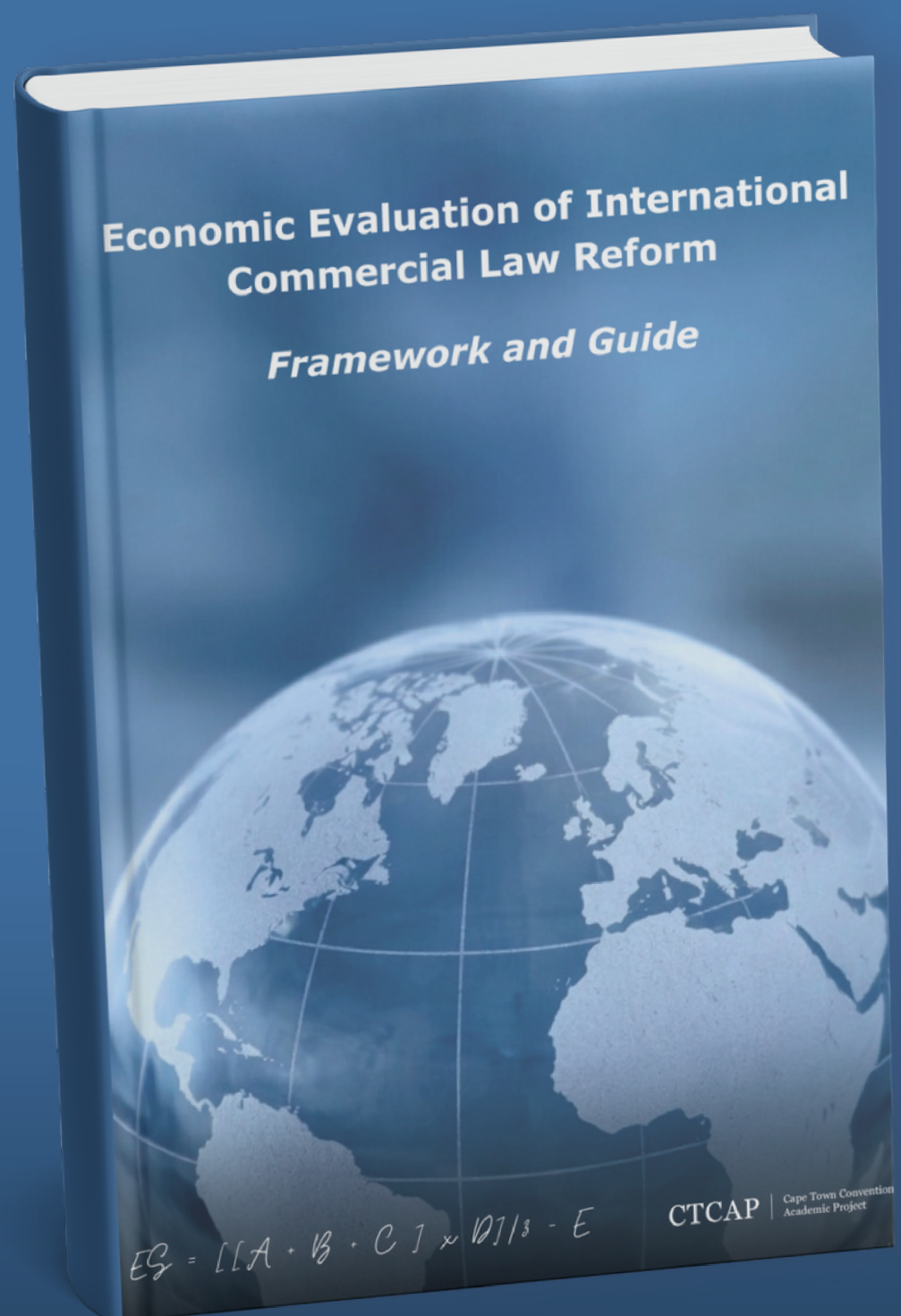

## ***About the Framework and Guide***

The purpose of the Framework and Guide is to provide a structured approach for measuring and quantifying, on an ex-ante basis, the potential economic impact of international commercial law reforms, thereby supporting more informed decision-making by international, regional and national organisations pursuing such reforms. Central to the Guide is a Framework based on a formula comprising five key Factors, each designed to capture a distinct aspect of the economic impact. The Guide offers practical guidance and methodology for applying this Framework effectively, largely through Benchmark-based comparison.

The project was conducted under the auspices of the Cape Town Convention Academic Project (CTCAP), a joint initiative between the University of Cambridge and UNIDROIT, with the Aviation Working Group as the Founding Sponsor.
